 - c. Additional valve requests neighbors continue to request the removal of valve or movement of valve to front yards. The district does not permit valve removal but an additional valve, paid by the homeowner can be completed. A form, which can be downloaded from the district website is required for approval and the cost of the additional valve is by the homeowner.
 - d. Water flood and overflows While the District continues to maintain and repair the system we must emphasize it is important to highlight the responsibilities of each homeowner. State law (ARS 45-112) requires each of us to restrict irrigation to our properties without overflow into the public right-of-ways. The board has created a new form letter to notify the homeowner if an overflow/flood has been identified requiring repair. The repair should be completed by the next irrigation run to ensure delivery of irrigation to the property be maintained.
- 7. New Business
 - a. RVIWDD Trustee Elections. All three district trustees are running for re-election: Andrea Forman, David Koger and Eric Poole. The following dates are pertinent for the upcoming election if any neighbor owning property in the district wishes to run for a position on the Board of Trustees:

7/23/2024 - Last Day to file Nomination Papers

8/6/2024 - Last Day to file as a write-in candidate

8/7/2024 - If no one files for a position, this is the first day to request the Maricopa County Board of Supervisors for an election cancellation

10/24/2024 - If an election is necessary, ballots are mailed out to district members 11/20/2024 - Election Day
